

Dry Creek Cleanfill

By entering Dry Creek Cleanfill, customers accept and agree to be bound by the following terms and conditions of entry:

1.0 General

- » Anyone exiting their vehicle on this site must wear the following personal protective equipment (PPE):
 - Hard Hat
 - Safety Eyewear
 - Safety Footwear
 - High Visibility Clothing
 - Gloves
- » Customers must adhere to the Dry Creek Cleanfill acceptance criteria as set out at part 2.0 of this document. By entering Dry Creek Cleanfill, customers are declaring that the material they carry meets this acceptance criteria.
- » Acceptance of any material at Dry Creek Cleanfill is at the discretion of Winstone Aggregates. The company reserves the right to decline any loads not meeting the acceptance criteria set out at part 2.0 of this document. If a load is rejected for any deemed non-compliance, it is to be removed from site immediately and suitably disposed of. As set out at part 3.0 of this document, customers may be required to indemnify Winstone Aggregates for the costs associated with this removal and disposal.
- » These conditions of entry are based on Winstone Aggregates' consent requirements.
- » We encourage customers to contact us in advance and as early as possible to work through the specifics of their particular job.

2.0 Acceptance Criteria

- » The Ministry for the Environment defines cleanfill as:

"Material that does not undergo any physical, chemical, or biological transformations that will cause adverse environmental effects or health effects once it is placed in a cleanfill. Cleanfill material has no potentially hazardous content and must not be contaminated by or mixed with any other non-cleanfill material"

- » In general terms, materials that *can* be brought onto the Dry Creek Cleanfill site are limited to:
 - Clay, soil, rock
 - Asphalt, which has no visible or detectable odour of volatile hydrocarbons
 - Bricks and concrete, including encased reinforcing steel (with no more than 5% attached timber).
- » In general terms, materials that *cannot* be brought onto the Dry Creek Cleanfill site are:
 - Combustible, putrescible, degradable or leachable components
 - Hazardous substances
 - Products/ materials derived from hazardous waste treatment, hazardous waste stabilisation or hazardous waste disposal
 - Materials that may present a risk to human or animal health such as medical and veterinary waste, asbestos or radioactive substances
 - Liquid waste.

- » Please be advised that the origin of waste can also affect its compliance with the Dry Creek Cleanfill acceptance criteria. Particular sites (e.g. heavy industry, petrol stations) may have contaminated soil or waste due to the work that is generally carried out on these sites. If the waste originates from one such site, the load will need to be tested prior to being accepted at Dry Creek Cleanfill. The test will need to be carried out by an appropriately qualified person, and the results will need to be accompanied by a certification statement that the material can be classified as cleanfill as per the definition in Section 2.0 Acceptance Criteria.

3.0 Non-complying material

- » Winstone Aggregates carries out random testing of material deposited at Dry Creek Cleanfill and on occasion discovers material which does not meet the acceptance criteria set out at part 2.0 of this document. Such material is quarantined and the customer responsible for the load(s) is given notice of that fact (via a Removal Notice) The customer will be required to remove the quarantined load, and potentially any other material originating from the same source that is deemed by Winstone Aggregates to be unsuitable to stay on its site, and to indemnify Winstone Aggregates for any costs it incurs as a result of such removal.
- » If a customer does not comply with the Removal Notice within 5 days of receipt, Winstone Aggregates reserves the right to remove the load and any other material originating from the same source that is deemed by Winstone Aggregates to be unsuitable to stay on its site, and dispose of the load at a suitable facility, in which case customers will be required to indemnify Winstone Aggregates for any costs it incurs as a result of such work. The cost for this work will be detailed in the above mentioned Removal Notice.

4.0 Being a good neighbour

- » Dry Creek Cleanfill is located on a busy road, and your assistance in helping Winstone Aggregates to be a good neighbour is appreciated. Please consider the following when planning to use the site:
 - The site's opening hours are: Monday to Thursday 7.00am - 5.00pm
Friday 7.00am - 4.00pm
Saturday 7.00am - 12.00pm
 - Trucks are not to arrive before 7.00am, and at no time are they to queue or park outside the site.
 - No engine brakes are to be used around the site.
